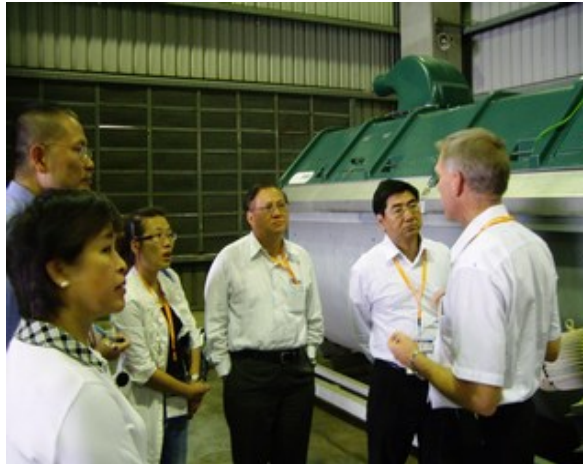

HotRot® Part of Specialised Manufacturing Canadian Trade Mission

HotRot, represented by General Manager/Director George Pottinger was recently invited to take part in a Specialised Manufacturing Trade Mission to Canada and Nth America, lead by NZ Trade Minister Hon. Phil Goff.

The Mission was co-ordinated with the inaugural direct flight by Air New Zealand from Auckland to Vancouver, and the sector was represented by 17 companies specialising in: aviation, marine, plastics, environmental technologies, mining and defence.

HotRot meetings were arranged with waste companies, municipalities, universities and other institutions who are becoming very aware of the non-sustainability of their current organic waste disposal methods, and also aware that pending regulatory changes will make many existing methods non compliant.

The Mission ended in Seattle, Washington State, where environmental awareness was acute, and some excellent initiatives were observed.

There was much interest in the performance of the first HotRot in the Nth Americas New Era Technologies HotRot 1811 at Halifax, Nova Scotia.
