Approximately 100 Produce Market Managers from across the USA gathered to discuss mutual issues, solutions and new innovations, one major one of which is waste disposal.

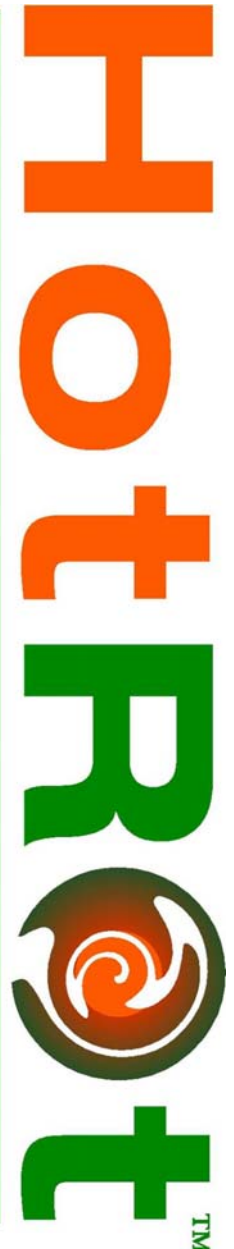
