## New 1509 for Indonesia

A completely redesigned HotRot 1509 is currently under construction. The new design incorporates all the developments of the 1811s and represents the first revamp of the 1509 since the first two commercial HotRot units were built in 2001.

This latest HotRot 1509 is destined for a remote work camp serving an LNG processing plant operated by a British Petroleum (BP) and Japanese Gas Corporation (JGC) joint venture in Papua, Indonesia. The camp supports 1,500-2,000 workers and serves 5 - 6,000 meals per day.

Watch this space for progress on the 1509.

## Opportunities Hot Up in France

The first HotRot unit to be installed in continental Europe is on its way to France. The 1811 is to be installed in Sete and will treat fish processing waste, along with grape march and olive pressings. Pierre Froidcoeur, Managing Director of Biozis, HotRot Exports' representative in France and Belgium, will assist with the installation of the unit in early February. Mr Froidcoeur indicated that "Biozis is very excited about this installation, particularly in light of a recent surge in interest for HotRot installations throughout the region".

## **Control System Update:**

As part of our ongoing development programme we have been reviewing the electrical and control components of the HotRot system. To date we have provided largely bespoke control systems. This has provided a good fit to client needs, but at a cost to development and extended commissioning.

Our new approach is to collect the needs experienced in the majority of installations and to collate these into a configurable control system that will meet most needs. This has resulted in a system that delivers more at a much-reduced price. Where unique needs are encountered, we can still provide a tailored solution.

Along with control we have developed a 'standard' specification HotRot consisting of the unit and discharge fan, with optional feed slide gate, air injection and discharge auger. Provision is made to integrate with feed and further discharge systems provided by others.

Key features of the new system include:

- Language support. The system is supplied in English/French and additional languages will be added as required. Language selection is achievable on a single key press.
- Reduced installation and commissioning costs. Field wiring has been greatly reduced. By using a single proven software solution, the need to test on site is minimised.
- Flexible remote access. The system can be connected via Ethernet to a range of remote access options. No remote access is provided as standard and we aim to place the choice in this area with the client.
- Greatly enhanced user interface. Control is via a 640 x 480 full colour touch screen panel.
- Flexibility in redevelopment. In the event of plant reconfiguration or upgrade, the control system can be reconfigured in a matter of minutes via the panel.
